

IN OUR COMMUNITY

There are many people who achieve the satisfactory completion of tasks without the community being aware of how these tasks are initiated, carried out and completed. I refer to people employed by our own local government authority The Town of Northam. Within the town precincts

we are often aware of changes and improvements and general maintenance to roads, footpaths, parks and gardens and other services we take for granted. Some of these changes are initiated by planning, building and health departments and other people allied to them.

A good example of our council workers' successful endeavour is the refurbishment and redesigning of Bernard Park down by the river. Take a look, it is worth it. The enhancement of the children's playground areas, the thoughtfulness and excellent finish to the paths and access for wheelchairs and prams is just a sample of the quality of the work carried out and is credit to all concerned.

Unfortunately there are occasions where blame is levelled at council unjustly over placement of barriers and structures which may be obstructions or an eyesore so it would be wise to check the origin of these barriers before passing judgement and while on the subject of safety it both stupid and dangerous to remove or smash the orange or amber flashing lights that are part of safety structures, parking on paved or formed footpaths is another bugbear and is also a dangerous and inconvenient practice.

It was interesting to note a recent editorial on the increase in building permit approvals and subdivisional applications, which of course leads us to be aware that with an increase in population, substantially more work will be created resulting in increased opportunity for employment within our own local government.

At this time we should be aware that the current work force is heavily committed to supplying the services we enjoy and rely on and are earning their current incomes to the max.

I toured around some of the work sites unannounced and photographed various people at a variety of tasks. That created a few comments!! and I was not surprised to find them hard at it.

One of the issues seems to be the littering problem. Bins are supplied at various locations and it seems some people have bad or indifferent aims as there is letter around the bin and not in it. In some cases bins are ripped off their anchors and stolen or thrown in the river.

Dog poo, for the sake of propriety henceforth called DLM (doggy land mine), is a wide spread problem in streets, parks and gardens, private front gardens and verges.

MORE THAN JUST CARS

If you happen to find yourself stopping over in Los Angeles, as I did recently, be sure to visit the Petersen Museum in Beverley Hills. Ten dollars gets you in to see 3 floors encompassing more than 3000,000 square feet, with more than 150 rare and classic cars, trucks and motorcycles.

The first floor follows the history of the automobile with lifelike dioramas and settings, allowing you to experience the automobile as it related to everyday life. The tour begins in a downtown 1901 blacksmith shop where one of the first automobiles in LA was built. It then moves on to the other vehicles in scenes of the day including 1911 American Underslung stuck in the mud with a spectacular view of the Pacific Ocean in the background. Vehicles on the highway are watched closely by a California High Patrolman on a Harley Davidson hiding behind and authentic LA Times billboard. Around the corner there is an alley displaying a 1932 Twin Coach Helms Bakery truck, a fully fitted out 1920's service station and a 1930's Bugatti new car showroom.

The other floors are devoted to specialist displays that change several times per year. While I was there, displays included a Hollywood gallery of famous cars from the movies, favourite cars and guitars from various rock stars (an Elvis car with bullet holes) and a great display of alternative fuel vehicles including original steam powered and charcoal burners, to today's electric, hydrogen and bio-diesel cars.
