At the last meeting of the AVVVA Mr John Bennington from the Veteran Sports Car Club addressed the Club members on the coming Flying Fifties event. He was looking for our support on the day, to display the cars and provide transport for dignitaries around the track.

Hi All,

Just an up date on the car club location, and proposed positions on mud map. Entry is by Minson Ave, from Peel Tce, (roughly opposite Northam Toyota).

We would like you to time your arrival time to be roughly in the 9 to 10 am time frame so you don't miss the action.

I would like you to nominate the number of your cars that might like to take part in the grand parade. (You may be restricted to the number per club if the total slows the running of the event.)

You will be asked to fill out a simple form, telling who owns and restored the vehicle, Make, Type, short history, etc., that will be collected on the dummy grid and handed to the commentators so the crowd can be given that information while you drive gently around the track. No speeding, overtaking, or any hoon like behaviour!

Any passenger would also need to sign the disclaimer. An official car will lead the parade, and another will bring up the rear.

Participants will be given a form of marker that allows them to enter the parade. The grand parade will take place after the competing cars have had their practice. The time, approximately noon.

Cars from the Avon Valley Vintage Vehicle Association will lead out the parade.

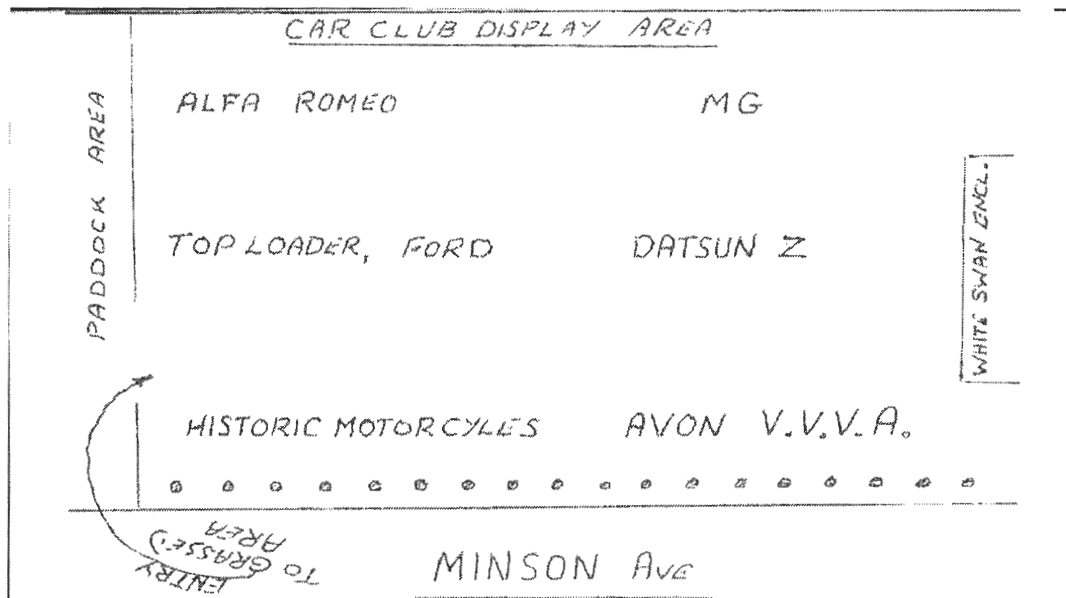
But for AVVVA members the entry will be only \$5 souvenir program per car irrespective of how many in the car.

STEEL

When you are doing repairs to your vehicles body you will, at times, need steel to replace the rusty sections of your project. Most of us will go down to the local steel merchant and pick up a sheet of 1mm or 1.2mm thick steel to do the job. If you are restoring a popular make of vehicle then sometimes Patch Panels are available to do the repair. These are reproduced sections of your car that are common areas for rust. If you need to, or want to make up your own patches then you will need the correct steel for the job. Yes, you can use any old steel but if you want the best working quality steel then read on.

Recently I made enquiries and now have tried out a top quality steel, designed for hand forming, it is a cold rolled steel but at a specific grade. I purchased this steel from my local agent, Midalia Steel in Farrell Rd, Bellevue. They can order it in for when you need it. Ask for COLD ROLLED CA.2SE. This steel looks exactly like all the others but when it comes to working there is no equal. The difference between CA.2SE and other cold rolled is like working with Copper and Steel. When I approached Midalia, I asked for Cold Rolled steel that had been killed with Aluminium, which is what gives it its malleability. The sales person had never heard of this steel but made enquiries and a week later had located exactly what I had requested.

The good news is that the price is the same as any of the other steels you may use. A sheet 1200 x 1800 x 1mm = \$30, so if you want to use steel that stretches and bends easily and can be annealed when it work hardens then ask for CA.2SE.

THE 2008 THEO'S RUN

Saturday 19th & Sunday 20th April

Long ago...79 years to be exact, the first motor races were held in Dowerin, initially at Speedway Lake, then moved to what is now the famous Dowerin Field Days grounds. The Second World War brought the "Days of Daring Do" to a halt and although some local racing started after the war finished, followed by some drag racing in the late 1960's, sadly the halcyon motor racing days faded into distant memory.

Although most of the original drivers are no longer with us, some of the people who used to watch the racing, still remember the excitement of planes landing with reporters and guests, the Black Tie pre-race ball and the souped-up race cars. The Shire and people of Dowerin decided to honour the memories of the old day, with an annual two day motor vehicle celebration, with the inaugural event in 2007.

Open to all car and motorbike enthusiasts everywhere, regardless of age and model, it's a two day event into the very heartland of the wheatbelt, to celebrate the good old days. Entry in the event costs a minimal \$10.00 per person (kids free). For those interested in WA's motorsport history, Graham Cocks (Fremantle Motor Museum), supported by the Shires of Dowerin and Goomalling has written a revised book on the motor racing history of the two towns and it will also include pictures from the 2007 inaugural event. The book will be released for sale on Saturday 19th April 2008.

The event starts with Theo's Run, on Saturday 19th May, with participants assembling at the Fremantle Motor Museum from 9.00am, ready for a 10.00am departure, led by Peter and Robin Briggs. The convoy of cars and motor bikes will make its way up the Canning Highway, onto the Great Eastern Highway. Then following the by-pass road will cross onto the Roe Highway, turning right onto the Toodyay Road.

The convoy will stop in Toodyay for a long relaxed lunch (at own expense). There's lots of great cafes, plus two hotels, or participants may choose to bring their own picnic lunch. At approximately 3.30pm, the convoy will set off on the final 70kms, heading for Dowerin, via Goomalling, arriving at Dowerin (23 kms from Goomalling) from 4.30pm, where participants will be allowed to angle park Le Mans style in the main street and mingle to discuss the run.

There will be an outdoor concert at Slater's Homestead (18kms west of Dowerin, starring Keith Potger (Seekers) and bank, together with other local musician. Please note, if the weather's inclement, the concert may move to an indoor location (either the Dowerin or Goomalling town Halls. There will be a separate ticket cost for the concert, however it will be BYO food and drink.

Sunday 20th April

On the Sunday morning, at 8.30 am, interested visitors will be shown the Wheatbelt Motorplex site (a short 5km drive east of Dowerin), then return to the town. Part of the main street will be blocked off to create a time-trial circuit, where regularity trials and demonstration parades can take place, from 10.00am through to 4.00pm. The time trials and demonstrations will include cars and motorbikes and even go karts.

Food can be purchased from the hotel and the service clubs will provide BBQ breakfasts and lunch. The event will finish at 4.00pm, in order to give participants time to get home to Perth before nightfall.

Intending participants are invited to pre-register, sending their details by email to: Claire@dowerinfielddays.com.au Regular updates will be posted on the field days website (listed below).

Please note: Accommodation is in short supply, however there is a hotel, a caravan park, plus a B & B in town and other accommodation is available in Goomalling (23 kms away) and Northam and Wongan Hills, (both 70kms away). There is also ample camping space at the Dowerin Field Days site (some with power) and these will be made available at a nominal cost, should demand prove necessary. A list of available accommodation is posted on the Field Days website.

It's a beautiful 170km run from Perth up to Dowerin via Toodyay and Goomalling and visitors might like to return to Perth via Goomalling and Northam, taking advantage of the Great Eastern Highway by-pass and lane extensions. Autumn is a great time of the year and it's a marvellous opportunity to come for a run out into the wheatbelt for a fun weekend of celebration, tall tales, motoring mayhem and country hospitality.

A 98 year old woman in the UK wrote this to her bank. The bank manager thought it amusing enough to have it published in the Times.

Dear Sir,

I am writing to thank you for bouncing my cheque with which I endeavoured to pay my plumber last month. By my calculations, three 'nanoseconds' must have elapsed between his presenting the cheque and the arrival in my account of the funds needed to honour it. I refer, of course, to the automatic monthly deposit of my Pension, an arrangement, which, I admit, has been in place for only thirty eight years. You are to be commended for seizing that brief window of opportunity, and also for debiting my account £30 by way of penalty for the inconvenience caused to your bank.

My thankfulness springs from the manner in which this incident has caused me to rethink my errant financial ways. I noticed that whereas I personally attend to your telephone calls and letters, when I try to contact you, I am confronted by the impersonal, overcharging, pre-recorded, faceless entity which your bank has become. From now on, I, like you, choose only to deal with a flesh-and-blood person.

My mortgage and loan payments will therefore and hereafter no longer be automatic, but will arrive at your bank by cheque, addressed personally and confidentially to an employee at your bank whom you must nominate. Be aware that it is an offence under the Postal Act for any other person to open such an envelope. Please find attached an Application Contact Status which I require your chosen employee to complete. I am sorry it runs to eight pages, but in order that I know as much about him or her as your bank knows about me, there is no alternative. Please note that all copies of his or her medical history must be countersigned by a Solicitor, and the mandatory details of his/her financial situation (income, debts, assets and liabilities) must be accompanied by documented proof.

In due course, I will issue your employee with PIN number which he/she must quote in dealings with me. I regret that it cannot be shorter than

28 digits but, again, I have modelled it on the number of button presses required of me to access my account balance on your phone bank service. As they say, imitation is the sincerest form of flattery. Let me level the playing field even further. When you call me, press buttons as follows:

- 1 - To make an appointment to see me.
- 2 - To query a missing payment.
- 3 - To transfer the call to my living room in case I am there.
- 4 - To transfer the call to my bedroom in case I am sleeping.
- 5 - To transfer the call to my toilet in case I am attending to nature.
- 6 - to transfer the call to my mobile phone if I am not at home.
- 7 - To leave a message on my computer (a password to access my computer is required. A password will be communicated to you at a later date to the Authorized Contact.)
- 8 - To return to the main menu and to listen to options 1 through to 8.
- 9 - To make a general complaint or inquiry, the contact will then be put on hold, pending the attention of my automated answering service. While this may, on occasion, involve a lengthy wait, uplifting music will play for the duration of the call.

Regrettably, but again following your example, I must also levy an establishment fee to cover the setting up of this new arrangement.

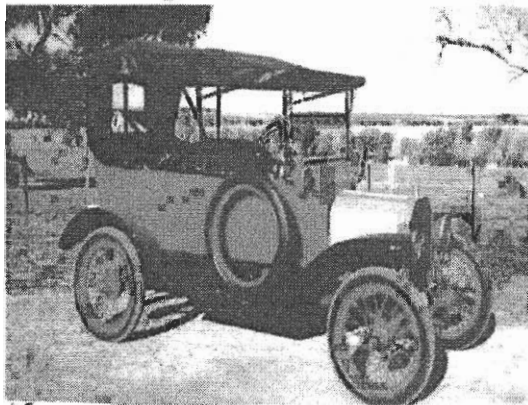
